

Thomas Roy Burke Sr. September 1, 1946 - June 22, 2020

Tom, a resident of Clearwater, Florida passed away on Monday, June 22, 2020 at AdventHealth North Pinellas Hospital at the age of 74, with his wife and son by his side.

He was preceded in death by his parents Harry Burke and Marie (nee Gallagher) Burke, and his sister Margaret (nee Burke) Colleluori.

Tom is survived by his son, Thomas R. Burke Jr, and his grandson "Tommy" Burke, and his wife of nine years Pamela (nee Singletary) Carr. Tom was the caring uncle of Marie Colleluori, Matthew Colleluori (deceased) and Erin Burke; and brother of Michael Burke.

Tom grew up in Upper Darby, Pennsylvania. He attended Saint Cyril Elementary School and Monsignor Bonner High School in Drexel Hill, PA. As a young man, Tom was a Wildwood NJ beach lifeguard, an athlete, and avid tennis player. He served in the Army in 1967-1969 in 71st Long Range Patrol (LRP) Detachment, 199th Infantry Brigade and was awarded the Purple Heart for combat wounds sustained in the Republic of Vietnam. He married MaryJane (nee Henry) Bostwick (div. 1973, d. 2001) after the war, and became the proud father of Tom Jr.

Tom worked in advertising throughout the 1970s and 1980s, and helped out at the family restaurant, the Koffee Kup, in Upper Darby, PA. After retirement from an administrative position at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Philadelphia, he moved to Clearwater, Florida in 2002. He enjoyed going to the beach, playing tennis, and eating at Frenchy's Rockaway Grill and Hooters with friends and his wife Pam. He loved the time spent visiting with his grandson Tommy, both in Pennsylvania and Florida. Tom was a proud long-term member of Alcoholics Anonymous since in 1995, and an advocate for others who suffered with addiction.

A memorial service will be held at Curlew Hills Memory Gardens at a date to be determined in late August or early September. The service will be held outdoors at the Garden of Meditation Mausoleum on Curlew Hills grounds in consideration of COVID-19

and social distancing.

The family is coordinating for a final internment with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery, Washington D.C. at a date to be determined sometime in late 2020 or early 2021.
